Established in the year 1981, the college was taken over by the Govt. of Assam under deficit system of grants-in-aid w.e.f. 25/03/98. The college was provincialised by the Govt. of Assam w.e.f. 01/12/2005 vide Govt. notification No. LPG. 112/2005/158 dated the 19th December, 2005. The College has been included under section 2(f) & 12 (B) of the UGC act, 1956.

Affiliated to Gauhati University, the college has been assessed and accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in cycle 2 in October, 2015 and awarded Grade B. COURSE STRUCTURE OF B.A., B.COM. (TDC) CLASSES (SEMESTER SYSTEM)

As per the regulation of Gauhati University, semester system was introduced in the TDC Classes w.e.f. the session 2011-2012. Accordingly, the TDC consists of six semesters covering three years. The following are the salient features of the semester system.

- (i) There will be at least one sessional examination in each semester which will be conducted by the college. Every student must appear in the sessional examination. Those students who fail to appear in the sessional examination will not be allowed to appear in the end-semester examination to be conducted by the University.
- (ii) In each paper 20% weightage is given in the internal evaluation and 80% weightage is given in the external evaluation.
 - (iii) There is provision for clearance of absent or failed papers.
- (iv) There is provision for repeat of any one of the theory papers in 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th semesters and a student may be allowed for 'betterment' of marks in one paper in the 5th semester provided he/she secures less than 45% marks in that paper.



16. SKILL DEVELOPMENT COURSES:

Kharupetia College offers the followings Skill Development Courses:

a) Spoken English Course: In view of growing need of acquiring proficiency in communicative English Kharupetia College introduced three months spoken English course from the session 2005-2006. As per the suggestion of NAAC, this Spoken English Course has been made compulsory for the major students of B.A. 6th Semester Class from the session 2016-17. An amount of Rs. 350/-will be charged as course fee for the 3 month Spoken English Course. Other interested students may also pursue this course on payment of the requisite fee. For details about the course, students may contact course co-ordinator Abdul Awal, Asst. Professor, Dept. of English of the College.

b) Computer Literacy Course: The College has a full-fledged Computer Education Centre with internet facilities. In order to ensure I.T. skill among the outgoing graduates, a three months computer literary course has been introduced from the session 2016-17. This computer literacy course has been made compulsory for the major students of B.A. 5th Semester Class. An amount of Rs. 350/= will be charged as course fee for the 3 month computer literacy course. Other interested students may also pursue this course on payment of requisite fee.



17. INSTITUTE OF DISTANCE AND OPEN LEARNING (IDOL):

19. SOCIO- ECONOMIC STUDY CENTRE:

A Socio-Economic study centre was set up by the department of Economics in 2004 with a vision to initiate research activities amongst the students and teachers. The centre tries to find out the factors responsible for poor socio-economic condition of the people of this region through Socio -Economic surveys and thereby to furnish the reports of the surveys with probable suggestions and remedies.

The department of Economics publishes an annual journal named 'Economica'

20. AWARDS:

With a view to ensuring quality improvement, the following awards/ incentives were introduced by various departments from the academic session 2003-04.

- (i) Best Student of the year Award: A cash award of Rs. 1000/- (one thousand) only will be given to the student securing highest Grade Point (CGPA) in the Major Subject in the B.A. / B. Com. Final Semester Examination.
- (ii) Cash award of Rs. 1000/ (Rupees one thousand) each will be given to the students securing highest CGPA in each Major subject in the B.A. Final Examination. If there is no Major student in a particular subject the award will go to the sutdent securing highest Marks / CGPA in that subject offered as general subject. These awards will be sponsored by the respective Departments of the College.
- (iii) Late Abdul Wahab Talukdar Memorial cash award of Rs. 1000/- (Rupees one thousand) will be given to the student securing highest aggregate marks (minimum 70%) in H.S. Final Examination.
- (iv) Cash award of Rs. 1000/- (Rupees one thousand) will be given to the student securing highest Marks/ CGPA in Economics offered as Major subject in the 2nd, 4th & 6th semesters.

(V) Late Hazi Maju Sheikh and Late Abdus Samad Memorial cash incentive of Rs. 1000/-(Rupees one thousand) will be given to ten students offering Mathematics as a general subject in T.D.C. Classes. The beneficiaries of these incentives will be selected on the basis of a qualifying test to be held by the Deptt. of Mathematics. These Cash incentives will be sponsored by Abdur Rahman, Associate Professor, Deptt. Of Mathematics.

(vi) From the academic session 2013-14 an award entitled the 'Best Library User Award' has been introduced. The award is given to the student who follows the Library rules and regulations like discipline, regularity, time consumed in library etc.

21. STUDENTS' AID FUND:

Financial assistance is granted to the poor and needy meritorious students out of the Students' Aid Fund which is formed by raising a compulsory contribution from the students of this college. Such assistance is given annually on receiving application from the deserving students (who obtained above 50% marks in H.S.L.C/ HS).

23. IDENTITY CARD:

College Identity Card is issued to each student at the time of admission. The students will have to get their ldentity Cards renewed every year. In case of loss of this card, a duplicate card may be issued on payment of necessary fine.

24. COLLEGE UNIFORM: College Uniform is Compulsory for all students

Uniform for Boys: Black Colour Long Pant (Jeans are not allowed), Cream Colour Full Shirt with black footwears & Maroon Coloured sweater.

Uniform for Girls: Cream Colour Kameez, Black Colour Patiwala Salwar-Pyjama (Slacks are not allowed), Black Colour Dupatta, Black footwear & Maroon Coloured Sweater.

25. ATTENDANCE :

Attendance in classes is compulsory. Students failing to attend at least 75% of the classes held will be treated as non-collegiate and those failing to attend 60% of the classes will not be allowed to appear in the Final Examination . A non-collegiate student will have to pay Rs. 250/- (Rupees Two Hundred fifty) as fine.

26. GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE:

The students admitted to this college are expected to maintain high degree of discipline. They must abide by all the rules and regulations as laid down by the college authorities. A college magazine named Kharupetia College Magazine is published annually with a view to giving scope for expression of the literary and creative talents of the students and teachers of the college. Besides this, a few wall magazines are also brought out regularly.

29. COLLEGE LIBRARY

The central library of the College has a total collection of nearly 18000 books including many valuable reference books. Besides the library regularly subscribe 18 Journals and five newspaper. Recently the library has been computerized and internet facilities have also been provided. The College Library is for the use of the students and teachers of the college. The facilities for borrowing of books by students are available subject to observance of library rules. Besides the Central Library, Departmental Libraries have also been set up to cater to the needs of the aspiring students.



30. STUDENTS' UNION:

Kharupetia college students' Union is the General Body of the students of the college. All the regular students of the college are the members of this Union. The President, the General Secretary and other office bearers of the Students' Union are elected by the students annually. The Principal reserves the right to dissolve the Union Body at any time on disciplinary ground and constitute an ad-hoc body till fresh elections are held.

31.EXAMINATION:

The college authority strictly adheres to college examinations and promotion rules. Apart from the Final Examinations to be conducted by the AHSEC / Gauhati University, every student of H.S. 1st year, H.S 2nd year. **TDC Classes will have to appear in two sessional Examinations.**

Appearance in these examinations is compulsory failing which a student will not be allowed to sit for the final examinations.

32. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

For all round development of the students, the College provides adequate facilities for various co-curricular activities like indoor and outdoor games, debate and symposium, cultural programmes etc. Moreover, lectures and seminars on various topics are also organized regularly.

33. COLLEGE CANTEEN:

There is a canteen in Kharupetia college campus. The students, teachers and employees of the college can avail the services of the college canteen.

34. INFORMATION AND CAREER COUNSELLING CELL:

An Information and Career Counseling Cell has been formed at Kharupetia College with the aim of helping the students by providing information about various career opportunities. Interested students and alumni of this college may approach this cell for necessary information and career counselling / guidance.

35. GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL:

The College has a Grievance Redressal Cell to look into the grievances of the students, guardians, teachers and employees of the college. The cell takes appropriate steps for redressal of the genuine grievances in accordance with the guidelines framed for this purpose.
